Summary of Volunteer Activity:

TRU UNICEF Club:

As an invested volunteer I am highly involved in all aspects of the club including but not limited to onboarding/recruiting, planning, fundraising, community outreach, and events. Due to COVID-19 Pandemic many of our original plans for events have needed to be altered to adhere to Health & Safety Guidelines, but we have still found many ways to fundraise for the club.

Two examples of our most successful fundraisers this past year included: (1) Our First Annual Run for Residential School Survivors planned after the Tk'emlúps te Secwépmec First Nation found 215 remains at the site of a former residential school in Kamloops BC. This fundraiser required planning, adverting via social media platforms and networking, tracking of each participants' kilometers, and donating of all proceeds directly to the Orange Shirt Society(to support reconciliation, and create awareness of the individual, family and community intergenerational impacts of residential schools. (2) Our Haunted Hospital Haunted House Fundraiser which required numerous brainstorming and planning meetings, recruiting and training actors, adhering to TRU's social gathering COVID-19 Protocols which included contact tracing and verifying vaccination status of donators participating, set-up and take-down of the event, advertising via social media platforms/networks, and donating the proceeds to UNICEF to purchase survival kits for high-need children in families internationally. These said gifts provide children with healthcare, clean water, nutrition and education to list a few in order to support them to not only survive, but thrive as functioning members of society.
